

## Literacy and Numeracy catch-up 2019-20

The literacy and numeracy catch up premium provides schools with £500 extra funding for each student who has not reached the required level in English and/or Maths at the end of Key Stage 2.i.e scoring below 100.

St Nicholas Catholic High School received £10816 for the year 2018-19. The school has responsibility for identifying areas in which the funding will maximise the progress of these students.

AIM: At St Nicholas we aim to enable students below the expected standard to reach this by the end of Year 7 or earlier.
