Dear Parents and Carers

As another Advent Term begins, there is once again much to celebrate and much to look forward to in the year ahead.


We celebrate a summer of significant success and offer congratulations to our Year 11 and 13 students who secured a fantastic set of examination results this summer. The dedication of staff, parents and of course the students themselves has enabled them to progress smoothly on to further and higher education, employment and training. I would like to take this opportunity to share a few of the 'Headline' figures:

- 82% of grades were awarded at grades 9-4 across all subjects compared with 66.9% nationally.
- One in four of all grades awarded at St Nicholas were given at the highest level (9-7) compared to 20.5% nationally
- 88% of students achieved a grade 9-4 in English. 84% of students gained a grade 9-4 in English Literature, compared to the national figure of 73.5%. 81% of students gained a grade 9-4 in English Language, 19% above the national figure of 61.8% - with 26% of students gaining the top 9-7 grades which is 12% above the national figure of 14%.
- 84% of grades in Maths were awarded at grades 9-4, 25% above the national figure of 59.4%

Our A-Level students once again enjoyed many outstanding individual successes alongside another successful year here at St Nicholas. Overall, 44% of all grades awarded at St Nicholas were at the A* to B grades with a significant proportion at A and A* - 13% of all our students achieved straight 'A's and A* grades across all of their subjects. These excellent results are testament to the hard work and dedication of students and staff throughout the last two years and the previous five years of preparation for these crucial examinations. As a fully inclusive Catholic Sixth Form we are very proud of the achievements of our students.

As well as academic success, the summer also saw students from St Nicholas participate in the Shrewsbury Diocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes offering their services as Brancardiers and Handmaids to the sick pilgrims of our Diocese. Our Sixth Form students took part in the Expedition to Borneo, our Duke of Edinburgh students participated in their Silver Assessment Expedition and our St Nicholas Summer School supported a number of students in their transition from Year 6 to Year 7.

We of course welcome our Year 7 students to the St Nicholas family. After many weeks of waiting, their first day at St Nicholas finally arrived on Wednesday and I am glad to say that the newest





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members of our community have already settled in to their new Form Classes and have made an excellent start to their first year at the school.

I am delighted to report a number of exciting improvements that have taken place over the summer holidays here at school. Through consultation with our students, improvements have continued to be made to our Sixth Form study areas, the Year 11 'Crypt' area has been renewed and the Dining Room has also been redecorated with new seating planned for next year. Phase 2 of our ICT strategy has begun with improved broadband width, wi-fi provision and laptop availability for students. The school has also been allocated £80,000 by the Diocese for the sole purpose of refurbishing the Crypt toilets. We hoped that this would have been completed over the summer, but will now take place late in the Advent Term.

Following discussion and consultation with the School Council last academic year, we have begun the term with a renewed focus on the high standards and positive attitudes that are expected from all students here at school by launching the '**4 Rs**': **R**espect for yourself, **R**espect for others, **R**espect for the School and **R**eady to learn. This affirming and positive approach to life here at St Nicholas underlines the continued responsibility that all members of our community have in supporting the spiritual, moral and academic development of themselves and fellow members of the St Nicholas community. Our new school website will be going 'live' next Friday 14th September and I hope you find it to be a great improvement and a helpful tool for ongoing communication and information.
