NEU Industrial Action: Tuesday 28 February 2023

You will recall from previous correspondence that the National Education Union (NEU) have announced strikes on 4 dates. The first strike date was Wednesday 1 February 2023. As you know, following a risk-assessment, we provided remote learning for all students on Wednesday 1 February. We thank you for the positive feedback received regarding our attempts to provide education on this date within challenging circumstances.

The content of this letter pertains to the strike action on Tuesday 28 February 2023.

Firstly, as stressed previously, it is important to note that the NEU's dispute is a national issue and not in any way directed at St Nicholas Catholic High School. The school's absolute priority in such circumstances is the health and safety of all members of our school community, with the adequate supervision of students a fundamental consideration.

We can assure parents and carers that, based upon a range of complex factors, we have modelled a range of different scenarios to explore all possibilities of different school opening types for Tuesday 28 February. As you will appreciate, the school timetable differs on each day of the week and, as such, each day presents differing demands in terms of staffing coverage.

Therefore, we can confirm that school will be **partially open on Tuesday 28 February 2023**. Our provision on this date will be structured on the following basis:

Year Group	Provision
Years 12 & 13	On-site attendance
Year 11	On-site attendance
Years 7, 8, 9, 10	Remote learning

Information for Students Attending On-Site Provision on Tuesday 28 February

School transport will operate as usual to enable Year 11, 12, and 13 students to travel into school in the normal manner. Catering arrangements will also operate as usual.



Information for Students Accessing Remote Learning on Tuesday 28 February

We remain committed to offering educational provision for students in Years 7, 8, 9, and 10 on the day of strike action and will be providing remote education for these Year Groups, which will be accessed via Microsoft Teams.

Students will be expected to follow their regular timetable of subjects online for the day and, wherever possible, they will have live lessons with their teacher. In the instance of a teacher being unavailable, students will be guided towards online work for that lesson.

Students received a virtual assembly prior to the previous strike day outlining how to access the remote learning package and expectations regarding engagement and conduct during the online lessons. Overall, this provision worked extremely well and the process will be recapped to students on Monday 27 February in school.

We are blessed with the positive behaviour of our students and we were proud of the manner in which they conducted themselves during remote learning. **Please do continue to support us by reinforcing the message of appropriate online conduct to your children at home during the day.**

Free School Meals

Families whose children will be participating in remote learning and are in receipt of free school meals provision will receive electronic food vouchers to the value of the daily allowance. These will be distributed shortly.

Future Strike Dates

As you will be aware, other strike dates have been announced by the NEU. However, given the evolving situation with the national dispute, it is prudent to deal with each date in turn.

The next scheduled strike dates by the NEU are Wednesday 15 March and Thursday 16 March. We hope that some national resolution will progress before then. If there are any changes announced by the NEU regarding their industrial action for Tuesday 28 February, we will respond and updated you accordingly.
