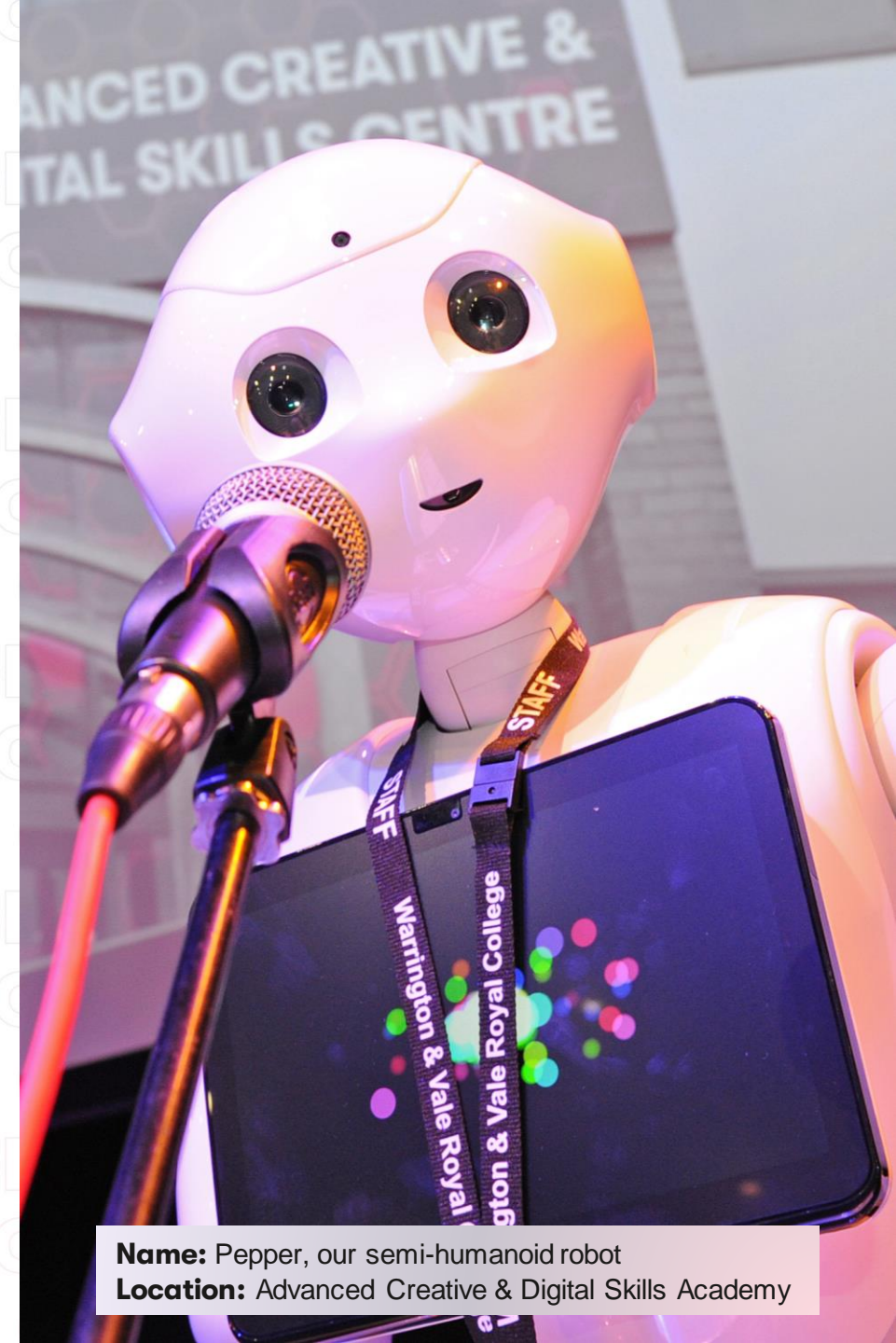

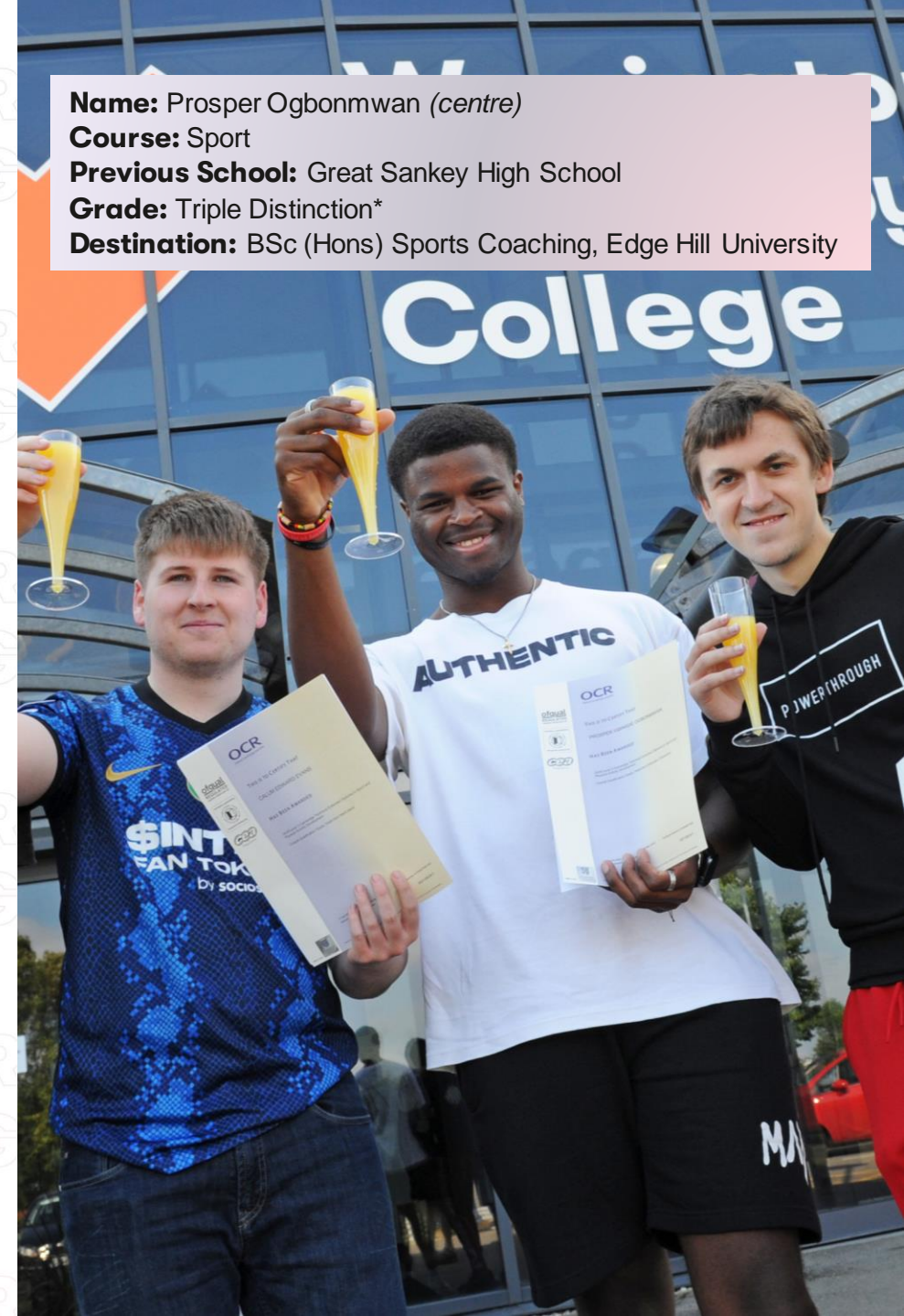

MYTH BUSTING

“Technical qualifications are for people who don’t do well at school.”

FALSE – Technical courses are chosen for learning style and career goals, not academic ability.

“Technical qualifications aren’t as good as A Levels.”

FALSE – T Levels and level 3 technical courses are equivalent to 3 A Levels. Distinction* is equal to A* at A Level.

“Apprentices aren’t paid well.”

FALSE – As an apprentice, you will earn a minimum of £5.28 per hour, and this could be much higher depending on your industry or employer.

“I cannot apply to university with a technical qualification.”

FALSE – More than 100,000 technical students apply to UK universities each year.

RESIT YOUR ENGLISH & MATHS

- We encourage you to try and strive for **grade 4s and above** in your English and maths GCSEs.

No minimum grades required.

Minimum of 4 GCSEs at grade 2 or above.
