Why do A Levels?

Facts about A levels: recent changes, subjects and grades, who they are for and what you can do afterwards.

Advanced level qualifications (known as A levels) are subject-based qualifications that can lead to university, further study, training, or work. You can normally study three or more A levels over two years. They're usually assessed by a series of examinations.

What grades do I need to take A levels?

You normally need:

- at least five GCSEs at grades 9 to 4
- at least grade 4 in the specific subject(s) you want to study

However, the specific requirements needed to study A levels will vary across schools and colleges. It's important to check what you will need with the school or college you are looking to study at.



What are T Levels?

T Levels are new courses coming in September 2020, which will follow GCSEs and will be equivalent to 3 A levels. These 2year courses have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares students for work.



T Levels will offer students a mixture of classroom learning and 'on-the-job' experience during an industry placement of at least 315 hours (approximately 45 days). They will provide the knowledge and experience needed to open the door into skilled employment, further study or a higher apprenticeship.

- ✓ Also teach business skills and the use of ICT
- ✓ Study day is longer than in a typical school and is more in line with a commercial working day.






Apprenticeships give young people the opportunity to earn a real salary as they work for a real employer, and gain a real qualification whilst gaining valuable workplace experience and skills.

What to do now....

Work through your careers booklet set by your form tutor on Teams – only completing areas that are relevant to you.

- Write your answers onto the form.
- Fill out the first section about current grades use your last T&M grade for your current grade
- Then fill out the sections that you have a particular interest in first i.e. Apprenticeship Section or Sixth Form Section. If you have time you can go back and fill out all sections.
- Complete as much of the form as you can.
- Don't worry if there are parts that you can't do right now.
- This is just to help get an idea of what you are interested in doing next year.

 - Research all local provisions and look at the entry requirements
 - You could use unifrog to research what taking those subjects/options at 16 could lead to post 18
